# New Visions Homeless Day Shelter

There are approximately 125-150 homeless men, women, and children that utilize their laundry facilities, shower facilities, mail services, food pantry and clothing room on a daily basis. In addition to providing homeless men, women, and children breakfast, lunch and basic necessities, New Visions frequently refers individuals for drug rehabilitation, employment services, along with housing opportunities. New Vision serves people who have hit rock bottom, who have no where else to go, who have a very low self-esteem, who feel that there life is not valued, and don't know where to turn. Their goal is to provide the homeless with the basic needs, but more importantly, providing them with a sense of dignity, a sense of love, and realizing that they are somebody.
